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Six Guiding Principles for ICD10 Training

- 1. Customize training to the role*
- 2. Assess competence and tailor training to the individual*
- 3. Provide training at the right time*
- 4. Leverage the full implementation time span*
- 5. Employ varied training methodologies*
- 6. Leverage training organization-wide*

AHIMA Certifications

- *No requirement to re-take certification exams*
