#### **Health IT Testing Program Enables Data Sharing for Approximately 50 Percent of US Patients and Providers**

More than half the US population and their healthcare providers could soon have access to health data shared across multiple states and systems. The EHR/HIE Interoperability Workgroup, a public-private partnership of states, public agencies, federally-funded HIEs and health IT companies, established a program to test and certify EHRs and other health IT to enable reliable transfer of data within and across organizational and state boundaries. ### **The Louisiana Approach to Achieving the Stage 1 Public Health Meaningful Use Immunization Option**

The Louisiana Health Care Quality Forum (LHCQF) is a private, not-for-profit organization dedicated to reshaping the quality, safety, and value of healthcare for Louisiana state residents. According to LHCQF, supporting the meaningful use of EHRs and facilitating statewide HIE are keys to achieving the goals of better health outcomes and creating efficiencies in the delivery of care.

### **Reducing Vaccine Preventable Disease through Immunization Registries**

The case study highlights the collaboration between Michigan's immunization registry and the state's regional extension center (REC). These two entities have been working together to ensure providers can satisfy the public health requirements for Meaningful Use Stage 1.

### **Immunization Registry in San Diego County**

The San Diego Beacon Community (SDBC) is a partnership of health care providers, clinics, hospitals, emergency medical services and public health organizations. SDBC's goal is to improve the quality of health care delivered for all San Diegans using health IT. The SDBC's largest investment is creating an HIE to support an electronic network that allows doctors to obtain patient health information from participating sites. In addition to creating the HIE, SDBC has a number of other goals and objectives, including increased provider participation in the San Diego Immunization Registry.

### **Standards, Implementation Specifications, and Certification Criteria for EHR Technology, 2014 Edition; Revisions to the Permanent Certification Program for Health IT**

With release of the final rule on Meaningful Use (MU) Stage 2, the Secretary of Health & Human Services adopts certification criteria that establish the technical capabilities and specifies consensus standards and implementation specifications for Certified EHR Technology. At a minimum, EHRs will need to include, and support the achievement of Meaningful Use by eligible professionals, eligible hospitals, and critical access hospitals under the Medicare and Medicaid EHR Incentive Programs. Beginning with the EHR reporting periods in fiscal year and calendar year 2014, this final rule also makes changes to the permanent

## **NLM Set to Launch Value Set Authority Center**

The National Library of Medicine (NLM), in collaboration with the ONC and CMS, will soon launch the NLM Value Set Authority Center (VSAC). Initially the VSAC will provide downloadable access to all official versions of vocabulary Value Sets contained in Clinical Quality Measures that support Meaningful Use Stage 2. The value sets provide lists of the numerical values and individual names from standard vocabularies used to define the clinical concepts (e.g., diabetes, clinical visit) used in the quality measures. The content of the VSAC will gradually expand to incorporate value sets for other use cases, as well as for new measures and updates to existing measures. Click the headline above to learn more.
